Founded in 1887 as a club for women employees who worked at Congregational House, the club sponsored suppers, house parties with skits and musical comedies, and Christmas gifts and dinner for a needy family. Thomas Todd was made an honorary member after the Spanish American War because he was the only man in the building who had served. His printing offices are in Congregational House. The club closed its books in 1969.
