HISTORICAL NOTE

The Emmanuel Church of Hastings, Nebraska, was founded in 1908. It was an active member of the German Congregational Association of Nebraska (later the German Nebraska Conference). In 1910, the Hastings Emmanuel Church boasted 103 members. The building is still standing, used by the "Church of Christ" according to the donor. However, the relationship of this current congregation and the first German group is unknown, as is the date of any change in status or name.

The materials in this collection were donated by Clarence and Emma Krieger, evidently descendants of early members, as the clerk's name on the minutes is Peter Krieger, and a George Krieger is mentioned on the application.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The collection consists of two legal documents, both dated 1908: a typed copy of the minutes of the meeting at which the church was incorporated, and an application for a grant to build a church. Also included are two receipts from Conference organizations, and a color photograph of the church building as it looked quite recently. The materials are arranged by type, the legal documents first, followed by the receipts, and the photograph.
